

# Gender Match Game Answer Key

1. Gender Identity: (E) How a person feels about and relates to their gender identity.
2. Transgender: (D) A person whose gender identity does not match the sex that was given to them at birth.
3. Cisgender: (F) A person whose gender identity matches with the sex that was given to them at birth.
4. Gender Expression: (H) How a person presents their gender on the outside, such as through their choice of clothes or the way they act.
5. Two-Spirits: (B) A term used to describe aboriginal people who assume cross- or multiple-gender roles, attributes, dress and attitudes for personal, spiritual, cultural, ceremonial or social reasons.  
**Note: In some Nations, being two-spirits means that you are gender fluid (or non-binary), while in some others it also encompasses being LGBTQ+.**
6. Pronouns: (G) Words used to refer to someone (e.g. him, her, they, them)
7. Anatomical Sex: (I) The male, female, or intersex label given to a person when they're born based on what their bodies and genitals look like. Many people think this is the same thing as gender, but it's not.  
**Note: Intersex refers to people who are born with reproductive or sexual anatomy which does not fit with typical definitions of male or female.**
8. Transphobia: (A) Being mean to or fearing someone whose gender identity does not match up with the sex that was given to them at birth
9. Non-binary: (C) A person who does not think of themselves as either a boy or a girl.  
**Note: There are many other words that people who don't identify as either a boy or a girl use, such as genderqueer, agender, bigender, two-spirits and gender fluid.**
